The Samuel Arnold who died in Marvland the other day, and who was said in some dispatches to have been the Samuel A. Arnold who was one of the associates of Wilkes Booth, was wholly innocent of any connection with the murder of Abraham Lincoln. Mr. O. H. Oldroyd of Washington, D. C., who is one of the best living authorities on the details of the assassination plot, says in his book on the subject, under date of October. 1901, that Arnold, the conspirator, was then in his grave, buried near Baltimore. The only survivor of the conspirators then was John P. Suratt, who is, or was quite recently, auditor of a Baltimore
